NEW YORK - A CITY FULL OF SUPERLATIVES

New York City is the largest city in the USA: over eight million people live in an area of 786 square kilometres which make up five boroughs. The most famous borough is Manhattan, often incorrectly used as a synonym for New York City because most of the tourist attractions can be found here. The inhabitants of the city area are called "New Yorkers"

New York City is one of the world's leading financial, business and cultural centers — it is full of superlatives: about 10,200 kilometres of streets and 1,300 kilometres of subway tracks lead the people through "the city that never sleeps". More than 500 galeries, 200 museums, 150 theatres and 18,000 restaurants attract tourists from all over the world. The cityscape of the "Big Apple" is dominated by skyscrapers and for forty years it has been the backdrop* to the world's tallest building, the Empire State Building. The city has always been a main attraction for immigrants and is popular for its ethnic diversity: in 2007 nearly 170 languages were spoken in New York City and about 36 per

diversity: in 2007 nearly 170 languages were spoken in New York City and about 36 per cent of its population were born in a foreign country. Little Italy, Chinatown and Spanish Harlem are just a few examples of communities that represent the city's cultural diversity. In the 1980s New York City had a significant population growth caused by a new wave of immigration from Latin America, Asia, Jamaica, Haiti and Africa. Today most of New York's new immigrants still come from these countries.
